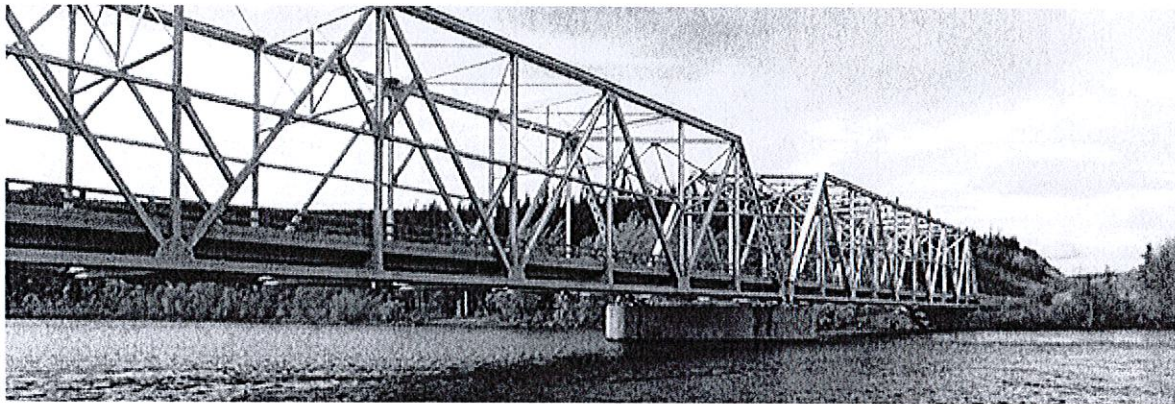

Update: New application deadlines for asset management grants

Since the call for applications opened in spring 2017, we have received a large volume of high quality submissions from across Canada for direct funding through the Municipal Asset Management Program (MAMP).

Due to high demand, FCM has updated the deadlines for municipalities to submit a grant application through MAMP. Below you will find the most recent information.

Municipalities outside of Quebec – submission deadline: October 23, 2018

The call for applications for asset management grants will close on October 23, 2018 for all non-Quebec municipalities. MAMP will accept application submissions until Tuesday, October 23, 2018 at midnight EDT, or until funding is fully allocated.

Quebec municipalities – submission deadline: April 1, 2019

Due to delays in the funding process for Quebec municipalities, applications for direct

funding through MAMP will be accepted until Sunday, April 1, 2019 at midnight EDT.

Spotlight: Sustainable police headquarters cut costs and GHGs

When the City of Prince George, BC, built their RCMP headquarters, they wanted to minimize the building's environmental footprint, as well as its operating costs. The innovative building they constructed generates annual savings of up to \$135,000 in utility costs and 165 tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions, and earned a LEED® Silver certification.

With funding from FCM's Green Municipal Fund (GMF), the building uses solar heating for air and water, recycles and treats rainwater, and connects to the community's shared energy system, which is powered by sawdust from the local forestry industry.
